"I had never attempted a painting before and challenged myself to complete a painting for my HSC."

She said deciding to study art at Riverstone High School in 2009 was one of the best decisions she has made. "My initial inspiration came from my studies at the National Art School, an intensive HSC theory course in year 11, where I was introduced to the work and philosophies of Titian (the renowned 16th century Italian painter), Shanika said. The program is open to eligible Centrelink and Department of Veterans Affairs cardholders as well as social housing tenants and some utility customers.
